







Keep Calm and Java On

TRC Computer Science Network

The Texas Regional Collaboratives (TRC) at UT Austin, in partnership with Oracle Academy, and TCEA, is offering a free series of courses for Texas teachers interested in teaching computer science. This series of professional development experiences will prepare participants to teach courses such as Computer Science I, Computer Science II, or AP Computer Science. Since the AP Computer Science course is based on the Java programming language, this will be the focus of the technical training component. The TRC CS Network will consist of both online coursework and face-to-face training held in Austin.

Session One - Fall 2014

ONLINE JAVA FUNDAMENTALS

- ➤ This 8-week synchronous online course in Java Fundamentals will consist of twice weekly sessions from 4:30 6:30 pm, either Monday and Wednesday, or Tuesday and Thursday. The course will begin the week of October 6, 2014. Educators will indicate their preference in their application for participation.
- Prior experience in programming is not required.

Session Two - Winter 2015

AUSTIN TRAINING

- Teachers who complete the online Java Fundamentals course, will be eligible to attend a free face-to-face professional development in Austin.
- > January 15-16, 2015.

Session Three – Spring 2015

ONLINE JAVA PROGRAMMING

➤ This 8-week synchronous online course in Java Programming will be an extension of the Java Fundamentals Intro course from the fall. Same twice-weekly session format will be followed. The course will begin in **February 2015**.
